CPS Caseload Standards Bill

S.2691 - Golden / A.10506 -

Lupardo

- * This bill would require the Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) to promulgate regulations relating to workload standards for child protective services (CPS) workers.

- * Currently, state law does not limit the number of active investigations each CPS worker may have at one time. However, an OCFS report recommended that CPS workers should have no more than 12 active cases per month.

- * Very few counties in New York State meet this recommended level, and some counties have average caseloads of as high as 70 per month.

- * With such high levels, it is impossible for staff to devote the proper amount of time to these critically important cases.

- * This legislation will ensure that CPS staff are able to dedicate themselves to each abuse and maltreatment case and will help ensure that children will not be further victimized.
